Database Overview

- The NZ SAR Resources Database is set up to assist emergency services and those involved in SAR operations to easily locate a large range of resources and a list of the capabilities /equipment that may assist in the running of a SAR operation.
- The Database is sponsored by NZSAR and administered by the Rescue Coordination Centre New Zealand (RCCNZ).
- For privacy reasons, the database is restricted to groups or persons who have been issued with a password.





 Below the Legend on the right side is the ability to select the type of asset you want, for example find a helicopter;


Click on the arrow on the right and a drop box will appear

allowing you to refine your search e.g. you need a winch equipped helicopter, check the box beside winch and all winch equipped helicopters will show on the map.





- Find a helicopter in the area of a SAROP and click on the icon.
- A box will appear giving the operator, helicopter type and range.
- For further details click on the blue circle - More Information.





A window will appear on the right giving detailed information on the operator, contact phone number, capability and some helicopter specifications.

The top left corner of the page shows a number of tools that can be useful, try these tools to see what effect they have;


 At the top is the ability to change the map type.





Next is the ability to add or remove a draggable datum marker which can be placed over the incident location.







- Click on the third icon down to add or remove range rings from the datum marker;
- This will allow you to find the nearest suitable resource to the incident location;
- The range measures in both kilometre and nautical miles and the distance between rings changes with zooming in and out.





 The fourth icon allows you to add a WGS84 latitude and longitude grid.





- Lastly, the fifth icon enables you to measure distances in both kilometres and nautical miles.
- Either end of the line can be dragged and dropped anywhere on the map.

You are all done for this new-user information. Now find the Database website and try the features for yourself.

Become familiar with the navigation structures of the Database so you are confident using those when called on.
