Review of SAR PAC Minutes from 20 February 2015</p>	<p><i>Discussion</i></p> <p>a) It is inappropriate for PAC to look at operational SAR H&S given the existing corporate responsibility of each organisation in the same area.</p> <p>b) PAC should be forwarding recommendations that have budget implications to the Governance Group for approval rather than actioning those without reference.</p> <p>c) Concern was raised about the ongoing timelines and lack of progress of some courses currently under development namely Investigative Interviewing, Outdoor Risk Management and Operational Tracking.</p> <p>Task: Samuel to follow up Investigative Interviewing at TPP with a view to moving it on.</p> <p>Task: Duncan to attend the next PAC meeting to carry forward the Governance Groups requests related to (a) and (b) above.</p>
<p>10. SAR (ACE) Three party MOU.</p>	<p><i>Discussion</i></p> <p>Duncan: A meeting request has been received from SARINZ. They have indicated they plan to approach TEC to gain a share of the SARACE funding in the next round. The meeting is to brief the Secretariat on their plans. If successful in their bid, the MOU would need to be extended to encompass three parties.</p>

This includes the SAR sector.</p> <p>SAR engagement with the TROQ process remains paused until such time that both the sector and our new ITO choose to resume it.</p>
